Advocacy is alive and well at Hesed House!

This past quarter has been very busy and productive. We registered 44 guests and residents to vote! Last year we registered 30, so our numbers were up substantially.

We are partnering with the Chicago Coalition for the Homeless (CCH) to address some issues currently on the floor in Springfield, and hope to take a delegation of folks from Hesed to Springfield on November 20th for an opportunity to speak with our legislators.

CCH helped us create Hesed's own advocacy team for our guests and supporters, called the Faith and Justice Alliance for the Homeless (FJAH). FJAH will lead the group to Springfield in November. We are looking for additional FJAH members.

We are also working as part of the Fox River Valley Initiative (FRVI) to research and address possible community-wide issues affecting our homeless population. Currently, FRVI is looking into mental health issues in Kane County.

This is our gift donation program in which donors agree to purchase gifts from a gift request list from people in the community who need a little extra help this year. This lets the families that we "adopt out" experience the joy of opening up presents on Christmas morning and spend some quality time together.

Transitioning out of Homelessness and into a home is a wonderful feeling, but it can also cause a lot of stress. The new home that people move into is usually pretty empty, and all of the "little things" that a person needs become sorely missed. That's why we have created the Hesed Home Starter Kit.

The Hesed Home Starter Kit provides all the "little things" that someone needs when they move into a new home. Items like dishes, laundry supplies and all of the other basics that make a home functional. Since we have started this program, about 25 kits have been given to families and individuals moving from Hesed House.

Our Thanks, and Best Wishes to Sisters of Mercy

The Sisters of Mercy have a long and storied relationship with Aurora and with Hesed House, and we want to keep them in our thoughts and prayers for their upcoming move to Chicago.

The Sisters have been a mainstay in Aurora for the past 104 years. Their relationship with Hesed House is foundational. Sister Mary Catherine Daly, RSM, along with members of the Aurora Clergy Association, was instrumental in establishing Hesed House and became its first Associate Director. Sister Renee Humble, RSM was also the first co-Director of TLC!

In recent years, the retired Sisters of Mercy at McAuley Convent (ages 80-99) continued to offer their services at Hesed. Every other month they had the opportunity to "feed the hungry" by making sack lunches which were passed out the next



morning as people left Hesed House... children going to school, men and women going to work, and to those who were not returning to the building before the evening meal.

The Sisters are now moving from Aurora, to their new retirement facility in Chicago. They have passed the "lunch duties" on to the Red Hat Society at Presence Fox Knoll!
